

## Attendance Overview Spring 1

Improved attendance at Clayton Village Primary School is something that we strive to achieve. We acknowledge that all our families are in unique situations. We encourage our parents to contact school to discuss any attendance concerns or difficulties as soon as possible.

The government sets out a set of statutory requirements that schools are required to follow in regards to attendance.

All schools must:

- Promote good attendance and reduce absence, including persistence absence.
- Ensure every child has access to full time education.
- Act early to identify patterns of absence.
- Parents to perform their legal duty by ensuring their children attend regularly.
- All pupils to be punctual to their lessons.

### How you can help?

- Let the school know at the start of the school day, by telephone or by sending a note with a sibling, that a child is ill or give any other reasons for absence. If you have been informed that your child is a persistent absence any absences will not be authorised without medical evidence or other proof.
- Inform the school again if absence is likely to continue beyond three days. A note, a medical certificate or proof of medication should be sent to confirm the reasons for the absence.
- Make medical appointments out of school hours. Where this is not possible, the school must be informed in advance of pending appointments. The pupil must be signed out at the administration office when taken out of school during school hours by a parent/carer.
- Parents/carers must apply in advance for permission for any exceptional absence e.g. a funeral.

#### Late Marks

Being late for school reduces your child's learning time. Learning starts in our school at 8.30am. Across school we start our mornings with phonics, reading and spellings. Being 15 minutes late has a huge impact on your child's progress in these lessons. If you need support in ensuring your child arrives on time to school please speak to Miss Needham, Mrs Knowles or your child's class teacher.

If your child is 5 minutes late every day they will miss three days of learning each year.

If your child is 15 minutes late every day they will miss 2 weeks of learning each year.
