Weather Reminder -

As the weather begins to change we often experience cold and wet conditions but we try our best to ensure the children can access outdoors at breaks and lunchtimes. Due to this can you please ensure your child has a suitable warm coat for outdoors which is clearly labelled. We also encourage our children to stay off of the grass as it becomes very mud and can often leave children with mud on their clothes. Please can you remind them of this.

Celebrations

As part of our promotion for healthy food and nutrition in school we will no longer be able to give out sweets, chocolate, crisps and cakes that are brought in to share for celebrations. If you would like to share with children in the class for celebrations we encourage bringing fruit or a small toy eg bubbles.

<u>Attendance</u>

We are noticing an increase in term time requests for holidays. While we understand that this is a time to spend with family and supports well-being as a Trust school, we follow the Trust Attendance Policy. This means the majority of term time holidays are unauthorised and can result in fines. Please see an extract from the policy below.



5.1 Approval for term-time absence

The headteacher will allow pupils to be absent from the school site for certain educational activities, or to attend other schools or settings.

The headteacher will only grant a leave of absence to a pupil during term time if the request meets the specific circumstances set out in the 2024 school attendance regulations. These circumstances are:

- Taking part in a regulated performance, or regulated employment abroad
- Attending an interview
- Study leave
- A temporary, time-limited part-time timetable
- Exceptional circumstances

A leave of absence is granted at the headteacher's discretion, including the length of time the pupil is authorised to be absent for.

Leave of absence will not be granted for a pupil to take part in protest activity during school hours.

PLEASE NOTE: holidays are not deemed exceptional circumstances and will not be authorised.

The school considers each application for term-time absence individually, taking into account the specific facts, circumstances and relevant background context behind the request. Any request should be submitted as soon as it is anticipated and, where possible, at least two weeks before the absence, and in accordance with any leave of absence request

form, accessible via the school office. The headteacher may require evidence to support any request for leave of absence.

Healthy snacks and packed lunches

As part of our continued promotion of healthy food and nutrition please can you avoid sending your children to school with sugary snacks. We are seeing that a high volume of chocolate bars, cakes and biscuits are being provided for children to eat.

Please can a healthy bar or a piece of fruit be provided as a snack and a limit of one sugary snack in lunchboxes. If an adult identifies a snack as unhealthy it will be removed.
